2.0 Items

- SOT and Educators/Community Members joined the meeting on Google Meets.

2.1 Review of Minutes

- The minutes from September 24, 2020 were read individually by the team. Mrs. Keyes motioned to approve the minutes. Mrs. Brunetti seconded, and the minutes were approved.

2.2 Celebrations

- Device and materials deployments are going well.
- Student attendance is high.
- High parent participation in parent/teacher conferences.

2.4 Construction Update

- Construction of the new school is moving along and on schedule
- It will be a two-story building.

- Kindergarten will have its own wing
- The building will have more classrooms and hold a higher population of students.
- There will be space allotted for an animal enclosure and gardens.

2.5 MAP Data

- Students in K-2 scored exceptionally high in relation to other years. This could be due to virtual learning and parents helping their children.

- A discussion was held as to how best to inform parents **not** to help their children on the MAPs and i-Ready winter tests. Suggestions for parent communication included: Parent Link Messages, individual parent/teacher phone calls, and Class Dojo messages. Future discussion will occur at the next SOT meeting as to how we want to proceed in informing parents.

2.6 School Performance Plan

- Mrs. Scott-Cherry briefly reviewed the plan and stated it would be posted on Mabel Hoggard's website.
- Three main goals were identified: Reading, Math, and Science.
- In reading, the goal is to increase proficiency by 3% or 62% (year before last) to 65% this year as measured by the SBAC.
- In math, the goal is to increase proficiency by 3% or 53% (year before last) to 55% this year as measured by the SBAC.
- In science, the goal is to increase proficiency by 3% or 24% (last year) to 27% this year as measured by the SBAC.
- There were no SBAC scores for last school year for reading or math due to Covid closure. Science scores listed above are last year's scores, as the test was taken prior to closure.

2.7 Title I Plan

- The school received \$95,760 in Title I funding for the 2020-21 school year
- Mrs. Scott-Cherry reviewed the concept behind Title I and how it is used to help increase student performance. (Required Title I meeting)
- 70% of the funds will go toward funding Dr. Maglicco's position as a math strategist.
- \$5,720 of the funds will pay for CTT hours for Mr. Swan in the reading lab.
- \$11,370 of the funds will be used for staff collaboration (outside of contracted time).
- 1% of the funds are designated to parent training.

- Other topics discussed included: measuring progress with MAPs and i-Ready, review of parent rights, parent volunteer policy, parent school survey (91.3% feel school is safe and 87.9% feel teachers care about their children), review of current curriculum, clubs, and that the funds are allocated in the spring of each year.
- Current curriculum includes Breakthrough to Literacy for Kindergarten, i-Ready Reading for 1st – 5th grade, i-Ready math for all grades, FOSS for all grades in science, and math number talks for all grade levels.
- Clubs currently occurring include: Zookeepers, cooking, creative writing, and multicultural clubs. These clubs are all held virtually.
- The Title I plan is available online on the Hoggard website.
- Also reviewed was the Title I Parent Family Engagement Plan. Data from the parent survey was reviewed and the plan was approved by the participants. The plan is available on the school’s website under Title I.

2.8 Title III Plan

- This plan is for our ELL students.
- \$7,222 was provided for Ms. Duncan, a CTT, who will work with the ELL population to increase English proficiency.

2.9 School Budget

- Currently there is \$306,043 in the school budget. This is more than we have ever had in a single year. This is the result of a carryover from last year’s budget (what we didn’t spend due to Covid school closure), free math pilot, and free i-Ready online programs for math and reading.
- The team will discuss school needs in future meetings in order to best spend the funds to support student achievement.
