A Message From The Principal

I want to thank everyone for my warm welcome to Hoggard Magnet School. It is very easy to see that Hoggard is an amazing school, with amazing students, families and staff members. I am so happy to be a part of this community!

Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students are actively preparing themselves for the SBAC assessment. They will be assessed in reading and math. Our fifth graders will also be assessed in science. The SBAC will be an on line assessment, and the questions will be more challenging and open ended, as compared to the CRT assessment our students have taken in the past. The teachers have been working all year to ensure that our students are prepared for some of the newer components of the test by allowing students to manipulate various technology tools on the computer, such as an on line calculator or ruler. Students have also had some experiences with typing their responses to short essay questions in the computer lab as well. As the days of taking a high stakes assessment in paper and pencil format are behind us, we embrace our responsibility of preparing students to be successful with this new format

Have you heard your children talking about how many raffle tickets they have earned lately? Another way we are preparing students for the SBAC, and encouraging students in all grade levels to read, is through our four week AR reading challenge. We are challenging all students to read and demonstrate comprehension of what they read, by passing as many AR tests as they can within the four weeks of this challenge. Every time a student passes an AR test they earn a raffle ticket for a Friday drawing during their lunch time. Prizes are displayed in the lunchroom and students eagerly listen to hear if their name will be called to win a prize. Several winners are drawn from each grade level every Friday. The classroom in each grade level with the highest number of passed quizzes during this four week challenge will earn an extra special prize. It has been very exciting to hear students come to me and share how many tickets they have earned this week.

NEWS FROM AROUND OUR CAMPUS

GATE: Stretching Brains and Making Connections

GATE students have been stretching their brains and making a multitude of connections as they explore diverse topics this semester. Fourth and fifth graders were exploding with excitement, literally, during their trip to the Atomic Testing Museum earlier this year. Students learned more about atomic bombs and atomic testing, which connected with the fifth graders' study of World War II and the fourth graders' project of the Explore: The Museum at Mabel Hoggard and the Nevada Test Site exhibit.

Third graders proved to be proficient at deductive thinking and solved the mystery of the "Great Chocolate Caper." They then kicked their thinking into creative gear by devising a personal "ode to chocolate," followed by a special chocolate celebration to savor their sweet success. Also in GATE, testing of second graders is under way. Results will be distributed in late May. Students eligible for GATE or TAGS will begin in third grade. Questions about GATE or TAGS or GATE testing may be referred to Ms. Stanley-Larsen, GATE specialist.

Second Grade: Gone Buggy!

At the beginning of the year, second graders observed the life cycle of mealworms. We watched them grow from a larva to a pupa, and then finally to an adult darling beetle. They are continuing to change which allows the students to observe an insect's ongoing life cycle. We apply our observations to better understand the life cycles of ladybugs, butterflies, and silk worms as they all complete a metamorphosis life cycle.

We have trips coming up in April to the Red Rock Canyon to observe nature, learn about Native American life and further our understanding of the rock cycle. Also, we will go to the Springs Preserve to observe butterflies in the observatory, and then to the Natural History Museum in May. We have had a very busy year!
